ICP cancels purchase of Liberty Ford land

Liberty Ford officials confirmed Monday that the pending sale of their Aurora Road site in Solon is off the table, just one month after voters approved new mixed use zoning for that area.

Liberty Ford officials said they were informed by Industrial Commercial Properties that the land deal will not go through. Michael Herrick, son of Liberty Ford founder Jim Herrick, said that ICP had until Monday to complete the due

diligence and whether to proceed to closing the purchase.

The notice of termination of the contract dated Dec. 2 from Walter Haverfield Attorneys at Law to the Liberty Investment Group stated, "The buyer is not satisfied with

the environmental condition of the property and hereby elects to terminate the agreement."

ICP had asked Liberty Ford to help pay for the research involving the condition of the land, and the

Solon physicians open free clinic in Hough neighborhood

Two local doctors are at the helm – and the heart — of a free clinic that they recently opened in the City of Cleveland.

The Salaam Clinic was founded recently in the Hough neighborhood of Cleveland by Dr. Syed P. Ashraf and Dr. Simee Malik, both of Solon, along with Dr. Marina Magrey, an internal medicine specialist at MetroHealth Medical Center and

a resident of Richfield. They began seeing patients about three weeks ago. The clinic, which includes three
